Dear Brother Andrew

It is so long since I wrote to you that I was beginning to get grieved at my silence. It has been a dull spring for carpenters but times are better now & every thing is lively. There was an awful tragedy committed here a short time ago a man named Ryan shot his wife & then himself, his dead body falling partly over hers. She had left him to avoid him as he was a gambler and a worthless character, while she was a very amiable woman. The Ladies made a collection and had her body interred in the Episcopal Seminary. He left a letter requesting to be buried along with her, which request was not carried out. Another man, who had

sold short ore savage and lost all he had, if he had lived three days longer would have come out all right ^{^shot himself}. His brother paid the ballance of his debts & financial expenses. There is great activity in all branches of the mining & milling interests in this State & the extension of the Virgina & Truckee on the line of the central P.R.R. is being pushed rapidly to a state of completion. There has been a

large influx of People to this
place this spring and lodging
has been scarce and dear. Some
have had to sleep in sagebrush
and side walks. I have always
